

ed, call our loan department for details. There are no application fees or points charged on these loans.

We are working on enhancements to keep up with the times:

- We will upgrade our Debit card processing system to bring enhancements to our membership. New Debit cards issued in October 2025 will be "contactless" or "tap" cards, as well as Apple Pay and Google Pay compatible.
- Our VISA cards are already "contactless", so if that is something you need right away, feel free to apply for a VISA account. Our VISA has rewards, very low fees, and a very low interest rate of 9% APR. We will be adding the Apple Pay feature to our VISA cards as soon as possible.

BEWARE OF COMMON SCAMS!

Take action in protecting your identity and your money. Never share information with someone that has contacted you and have never met in person.

If you authorize a withdrawal or payment, and later find out it was a scam, there is no way to recover the money. If you are ever in doubt, call the Credit Union at 805-682-2467 or speak to a trusted family member or friend.

These are a few of the most common scams:

TECH SUPPORT SCAMS

You may receive a pop-up window alerting you of a virus or malware on your computer. It will have a link or phone number, or both, where you can contact customer support. These scams are very common and if you click the link or call the phone number, it will lead to a request for funds. Never take any action with this type of alert. If in doubt, contact a trusted person that can help you or contact a reputable tech support company directly using your own online search.

IMPERSONATION SCAMS

Scammers will pose as representatives of credit unions, banks, government agencies like the Social Security Administration or companies like Amazon or PayPal. They can

even spoof the phone number on caller ID to make it appear as a real call. Emails and texts are also used to send fake messages appearing to be from Amazon, PayPal and package delivery services like UPS and USPS. If you receive any communication you are not expecting or seems suspicious, call us at 805-682-2467 or call the company or agency directly using a phone number you look up yourself.

You may be the victim of a scam, if:

- 1. Someone gives you instructions or is on the phone while you make a cash withdrawal.
- 2. You are under pressure to take immediate action.
- 3. You are about to withdraw cash, buy Apple store or other prepaid gift cards or transfer money through an ATM because you are in a high-pressure situation that involves someone you have not met in person.

It can start with a random text or social media contact or even an online communication through a dating app you've subscribed to. It can take weeks or months to establish a relationship with someone that





you only speak to through a device and they will always have an excuse to not meet you in person. Eventually, the person will be in a situation that requires money immediately, whether it's a family emergency or a once in a lifetime investment. You may feel compelled to either invest,

give or lend money to this person. They may continue asking for money until you've exhausted all your savings and then they will stop communicating all together.
